THE two A.B.J. models listed at almost identical except that the autocycle is fitted with the 98 c.c. Villiers Mark 2F single-speed engine and with pedalling gear, whereas the motor cycle has the 98 c.c. Mark IF power unit which incorporates a two-speed gear with handlebar control.

Specification details are a loop-type tubular frame, a telescopic fork, deeply valanced front mudguard, 4in-diameter brakes and 2.25 x 21in tyres. The motor cycle is fitted with rectifier-battery lighting
