Touring Bags

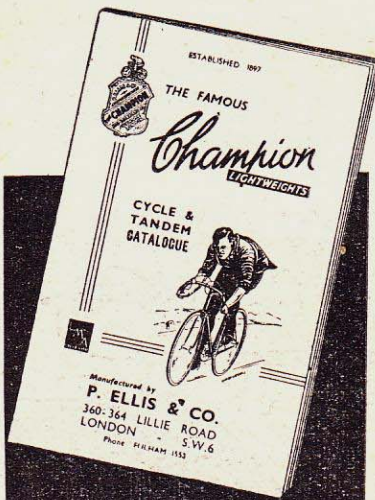

A small bag can be obtained for as little as 1s. 3d., while among the better models there is an all-leather bag with three pockets and steel stiffener on back. It is size 13 x 8 x 8 in. and the cost is 12s. Supports for bags are sold by this firm to suit all requirements. They are light and strong and will treble the life of a bag. Prices vary from 7½d. for a simple wire model to two shillings for a special model in rolled aluminium.
