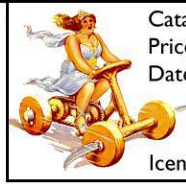

# Around the Trade . . .

## SMITH'S "SPORTSMAN'S" SPECIALITIES

FROM the factories of A. J. Smith and Co. comes a special range of touring bags, with prices from 1s. 3d. to 12s.

"Sportsman" No. 14 is the line selling at 12s., and it is an all-leather model with dimensions of 13 in. x 8 in. x 8 in. Strengthened by a steel stiffener it is fitted with three pockets (two side and one back), and besides the usual straps for fixing, cape straps are fitted on the flap.

This bag is made of such a quality that guarantees itself for long service and good wear.

The 10s. line is a patented article and is one of the most useful touring bags on the market.

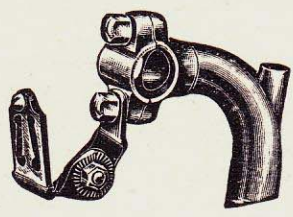
It is called the New Departure "Sportsman's" No. 5, and is fitted on the machine by a light steel carrier. The system of fixing is by means of turn studs, four in number, which make the bag easily detachable, and a handle accurately placed makes it comfortable to carry.

The material is waterproof rubberised grey drill, fibre lined, and the bag is fitted with three pockets and cape straps. The price includes lightweight carrier, etc., complete.

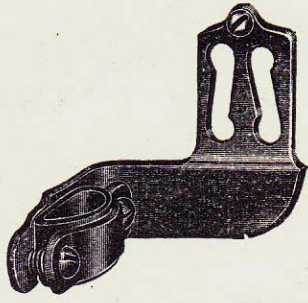
A more modestly priced bag is the No. 8 in the series. Shaped to fit snugly under the saddle, made of corrugated full bright black material on blue black duck, and fitted with a steel stiffener and wide leather support on back are some of the recommendable features of this model, and the price is 6s.

This firm also specialises in lamp brackets of every description, and in this line a new addition has been made.

It is made in two parts with fittings to fix on the handlebar stem as illustrated. In chrome the bracket sells at 1s., and in either nickel or enamel at 10d. The

screw at the top of the bracket is for prevention against theft.

The other model illustrated is for fixing to the front fork and is called No. 17n. This gadget is available in either D to R or oval patterns and is priced at 4d.

In the toecap series the interest is shared by the wire and steel varieties.

The most popular of the steel is the "Sportsman's" clip. It is adjustable and at 1s. 6d. is plated in nickel, while for 2s. a chrome clip can be obtained.

In the other section the choice is offered between fixed and adjustable wire clips. The fixed one is made of tempered spring steel and finished in ebony enamel, retailing at 11d. per pair, while the No. 8 A.D.J. is adjustable and is 1s. per pair.

Carriers, toe straps—quick release and otherwise—spanners, tyre levers, etc., are also turned out by this firm in huge quantities and are manufactured at Falcon Works, Regent-parade, Birmingham, 1, from which address catalogues can be obtained.
