Messrs. Brampton Bros. held their annual meeting on the 25th
ult. The report stated that the demand for goods having outrun
the capacity of the works, the sum of £9,000 was expended in
additional factory accommodation.

In moving the adoption of the report, the chairman (Mr. C. H.
Brampton) said the Company had been so pressed by orders that
it had scarcely known how to get them out, and the directors
had been forced to strain every effort to meet the demand. With
the same capital the Company was manufacturing from three to
four times more goods. The trade at Calais was profitable.

prices had fallen off considerably, the Company had, by increased
output and internal economy, maintained the profits. There had
been a considerable reduction in the price of bicycles during the

well when selling large quantities of goods at a smaller price
than in the old days when they had a restricted business and
