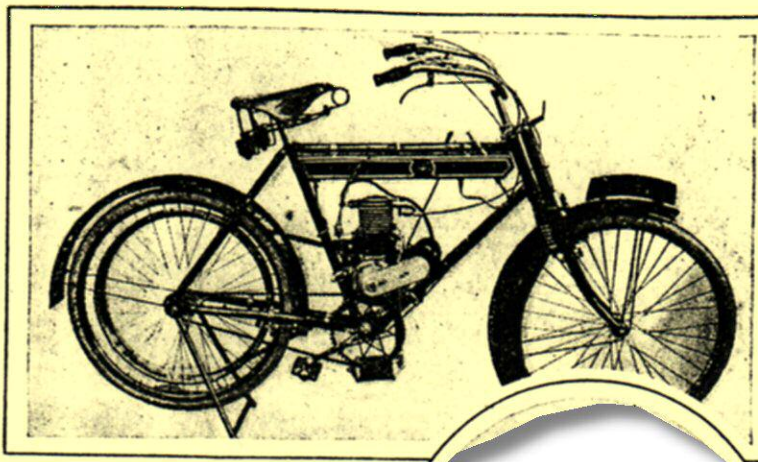

THE DAYTON.

A motorcycle which ranks next to the smallest two-stroke made is the Dayton, with its tiny engine of but 162 c.c. The engine is built into an extra heavy cycle frame, a high pedalling gear being provided by means of which powerful assistance can be given on stiff hills.

This machine makes a special appeal to the pedal cyclist. The engine is remarkably silent, it being almost impossible to hear the purr of the explosions. It is a noteworthy fact that when riding this particular machine we noted that it "two-stroked" every and all the time.
