Kerry (later to become Partco) imported a selection of machines from the Testi range and simply re-badged them as Kerry Capitano. As well as the 2-speed, 3-speed, Scooterette and the sports-styled Grand Prix, Kerry also brought in examples of the Weekend Cross and a three-wheeler.
