Membership

The attendance at this year's events - around 25 on wet days and twice that when it's fine - shows what an amazingly active lot you are. There's a rule-of-thumb in any successful

club that you can only expect about 10% of the membership to take part in anything. Our membership has climbed up to around 230. That means we're getting over 10% of the total membership turning up at a single event on a wet day. Looking through the membership list, over half of you will have turned up at at least one event during the year. That's quite extraordinary. Long may it continue.

Committee

We held a committee meeting at the Radar Run. As a rule, we let the club meander along its own way and only hold committee meetings when there's something important to discuss. This time it was something a bit heavyweight: a child protection policy. We had realised that, as it's legal to ride a moped at age 16, it was possible that we could have unaccompanied under-18s taking part in club events. That meant, either we had to prevent it, or think about child protection. No contest, then. Encouraging young riders is the only sensible way to go. We've agreed a Child Protection Policy and it's available from the club website. Contact the secretary if you would like a paper copy. We would particularly like to thank the FBHVC for the help they gave us in drawing up a suitable policy.
