BETTER AND BETTER

BOUGHT last October, the family Heinkel "Perle" has now covered more than 1,700 miles and is showing a markedly improved performance! We all know, of course, that a moped requires to be well "run in "—that is, gently used during the first 500 miles of its existence—if the full advantage of later bedding-down in the unit is not to be lost. On the other hand, I was quite unprepared for the sudden increase in available performance which I noted after 1,500 miles had been logged.

When tested, the machine had done some 300 miles, and gave a top speed of 33 m.p.h. This has now become its cruising speed, and top speed has moved up to 35 or 36 m.p.h. More striking, however, is the terrific boost which has become evident in hill-climbing. The "Perle," from being a better-thanaverage climber, is now one of the best low-speed pulling mopeds I have encountered, and can tackle in top gear hills which a month or so ago demanded bottom cog. Acceleration, too, is smarter, with bottom gear yielding a usable 20 m.p.h .- two or three miles an hour more than was previously obtainable. Fuel consumption has remained steady at an overall 130 m.p.g., despite hard riding. CENTAUR.
