 “Wolber” tyre, the tyre upon
 which Opperman accomplished
 his recent Portsmouth and back
 record and upon which Antonin
 Magne won the World's Profes-
 sional Road Championship last
 year.

 For a long time Wolber tyres
 have been known to dis-
 criminating professionals for
 their puncture-resisting qualities.
 Opperman's record, it will have
 been noted, was accomplished
 without trouble of any kind and
 without so much as a suspicion of
 a puncture, whilst the immunity
 of Magne from deflations in last
 year's Professional Road Cham-
 pionship must be taken as a de-
 finite triumph for the makers of
 his tyres, as this event was
 marred to an almost unprece-

dedented extent by the bugbear of
 punctures.
 The most interesting of the
 “Wolber” range is perhaps the
 “Champion du Monde” at 27s. 6d.
 Then there is also the special path
 tyre at 25s.; and the “Tour de
 France,” a less expensive addition
 to the range, suitable either for
 road or grass, at 13s. 6d.
 Many roadmen have already
 made up their minds to try out
 these remarkable tyres, which
 combine speed with exceptional
 puncture - resisting properties.
