A.B.J. Cyclemotor

THE A. B. Jackson Cycle Company has announced a new cyclemotor to be known as the Auto Minor. The engine is a two-stroke of 49 c.c. capacity, and it can be supplied mounted on a fork suitable for attaching to most cycles, or complete with a special bicycle designed for cyclemotor use. The entire unit, complete with the ½-gallon petroil tank, is quickly detachable and grouped as compactly as possible about the steering head. Drive is by carborundum roller on to the front tyre.
