FINAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPETITORS

1. Your entry in the National Rally having been accepted, please find enclosed:-
  - (a) Number Card
  - (b) Control Card
  - (c) Lapel Badge for driver
  - (d) List of Controls
  - (e) Lunch ticket(s), if ordered.
  - (f) A card which will entitle you to certain concessions in Weston-Super-Mare
2. Your number card should be fixed securely to the front of the vehicle, facing forward and clear of all obstructions.
3. BEFORE YOU START enter all relevant particulars in the space provided on the first page of your Control Card.

PRESENT YOUR CARD at each Control you call at for the name of the Control, the A.C.U. Official Stamp and the Mileage from the last Control to be entered in.

In the case of the FIRST CONTROL ONLY your starting time will be recorded in the last column. There is no time check at Subsequent Controls until the Final Control at Weston-Super-Mare.

On arrival at Weston-Super-Mare you must fill in on the front of the Control Card the total mileage claimed (on the basis of the mileages given in the List of Controls) and the number of Controls you have visited. Then sign in the space provided, and hand in your card.

IMPORTANT: If you are the holder of an R.A.C./A.C.U. Proficiency Certificate, please be sure to mark a bold capital P on the top right-hand corner of your Control Card, above the word 'NUMBER'.

4. One lapel badge with the driver's number inscribed should be worn by the person signing the entry form. This will ensure free entry to the parking area at Weston for all persons carried on the entered motorcycle during the Mileage Competition, as well as one free copy of the Souvenir Programme per entry.
5. The List of Controls shows the location and addresses of the 125 Controls which have been set up. The mileages between Controls, as printed in the List, have been compiled from a standard road book and must be accepted as correct.

6. At difficult points on the route approaching each Control direction signs 11" x 7" will be put up at the roadside. The signs are as follows:-

WHITE "L" ON BLUE BACKGROUND - TURN LEFT  
WHITE "R" ON RED BACKGROUND - TURN RIGHT  
BLUE "S.O." ON WHITE BACKGROUND - STRAIGHT ON

The roads in the vicinity of Weston will be signposted.

7. In the interest of all concerned, may I urge you to exercise special consideration on the roads, particularly as regards excessive noise at night in built-up areas.

Upon arrival at Weston-Super-Mare you will find that an attractive programme of entertainment has been arranged for your enjoyment:-

From 11 a.m. to 12 noon. The Ferodo Works Band will be playing popular light music in the Beach Lawn Band Stand, on the Promenade.

At 2.15 p.m., and again at 5.15 p.m. approx., the Royal Corps of Signals will be giving their famous trick motorcycling display. Interval music will be played by the Ferodo Works Band.

In addition the enclosed concession card issued by the Weston-Super-Mare Borough Council entitles you to:-

Free admission to the Marine Lake

Free admission to the Orchestral Concerts at the Rozel Bandstand (not to be confused with the Beach Lawn Bandstand).

Half price admission to the swimming pool.

Reduced charge from 1/6d to 1/- for admission to the Winter Gardens Pavilion for the Sunday "Pops" Concert commencing at 7.45 p.m.
