AJW Motorcycles was founded by Arthur John Wheaton in 1926. The firm originally used Anzani, Rudge and Villiers engines. In 1946 the company changed ownership but production of the 500 cc Fox models continued with most machines

going for export. The first of the Fox Cub series was produced in 1958 using a 50 cc Minarelli engine and since then all AJW bikes have been powered by Minarelli engines. In recent years all production has been subcontracted to Italian manufacturers to AJW designs and specifications. The name of AJW has changed ownership for a second time but production is continuing with a British built moped, the Fox Cub, powered by a 50 cc Minarelli engine. Plans are in hand, however, to replace this with a British designed and built engine.
