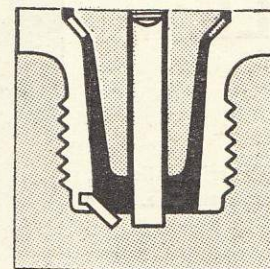

*Special Plugs for Two-strokes*

**S**OLUTION of many of the problems of two-stroke's sparking plugs is claimed with the introduction by Lodge Plugs Ltd., Rugby, of their Silver Electrode range.

These have been specially designed to cope with the arduous conditions of service in a two-stroke engine, and their special feature is the use of a centre electrode of silver, which conducts heat seven times faster than does the conventional nickel electrode. It therefore remains cool and, being non-magnetic, has less tendency to "whisker," for this condition is usually caused by the attraction of minute metallic particles by the electrode.

Other points about the Silver Electrode series are the longer insulator nose, which helps to reduce fouling, and the reduction of the danger of pre-ignition as a result of the speedier heat transference from the firing points. Both grades—the CC 14 and HH 14, recommended for normal use and fast driving respectively—retail at 6s. 6d. each.
